Lorie Line was born with “perfect pitch”. She has been playing piano since age 5 and as a child prodigy, she won many annual Statewide piano competitions. Classically trained, she graduated from the University of Nevada, Reno, with a BA in Music Piano Performance. In 1986 she moved to Minneapolis, and landed the perfect job serenading shoppers at the piano for Dayton’s Department Stores. Midwest fans took notice of her musical talent and style and her career took off. Since then she has recorded 46 CDs, published 43 books of music, sold 6 million albums and has toured the United States for 25 consecutive years, performing on over 2,000 stages. She continues to be the hardest working woman in show biz, touring and performing in 80 cities each year. She has produced three television specials for PBS, played for Congressmen, Senators and Governors and for two Presidents in the White House.
