Marilyn Sellars started singing in church at the age of three. As a teenager she sang at functions and clubs around Minnesota singing all kinds of music.

In 1973, family and friends suggested she move to Nashville and signed with Mega Records and success began with “One Day at a Time.” In 1974, the song reached number 19 on the country charts and number 37 on the Billboard Hot 100. The album went to number one on the country charts taking over Elvis Presley.

Her success included ASCAP and Best New Female Artist, an Academy of Country Music nomination and appearance on many nation TV shows.

In the late 70’s, Marilyn moved back to Minnesota to raise a family and has continued to perform and record albums. In 2004, she was inducted into the Minnesota Country and Rock Hall of Fame.
